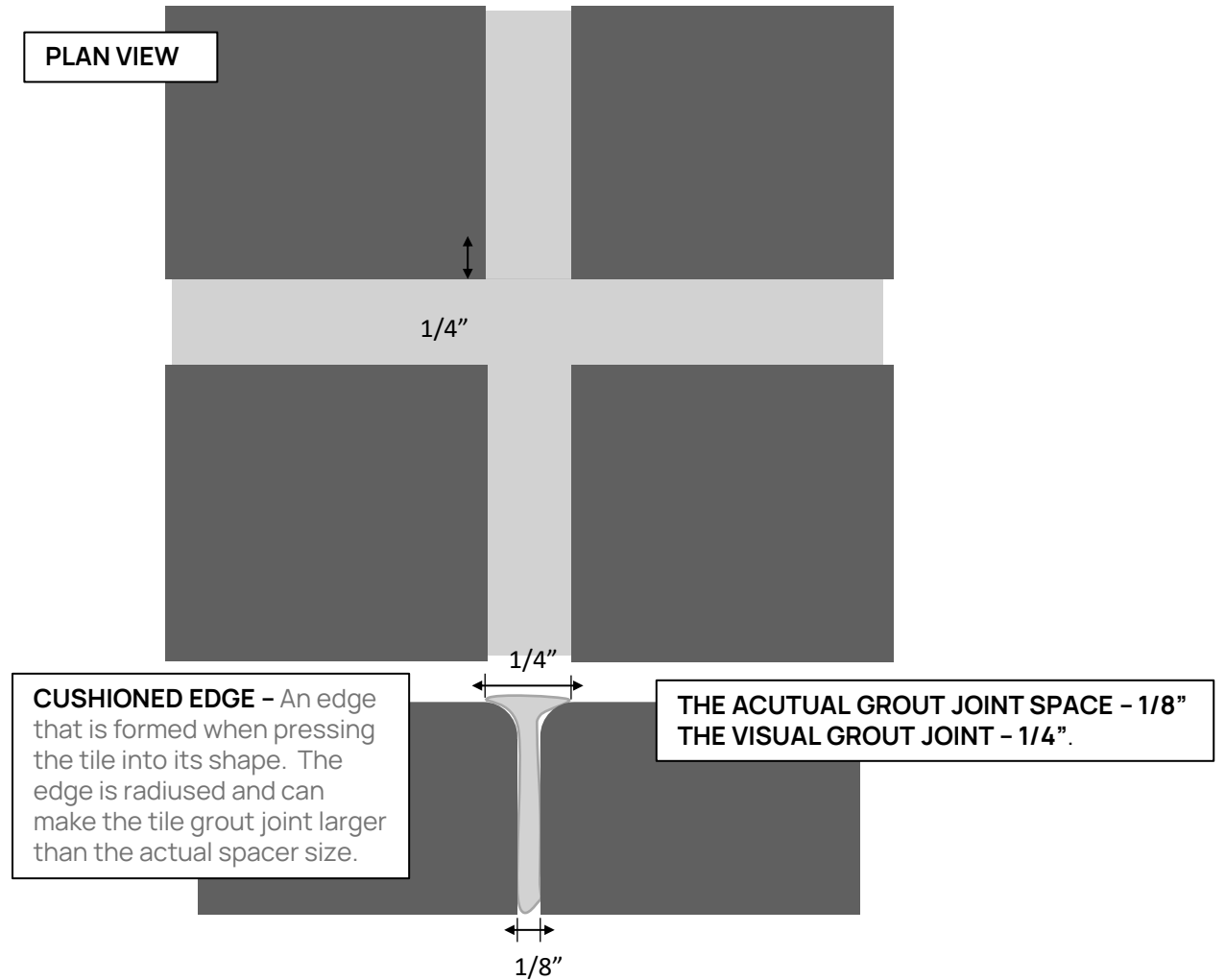

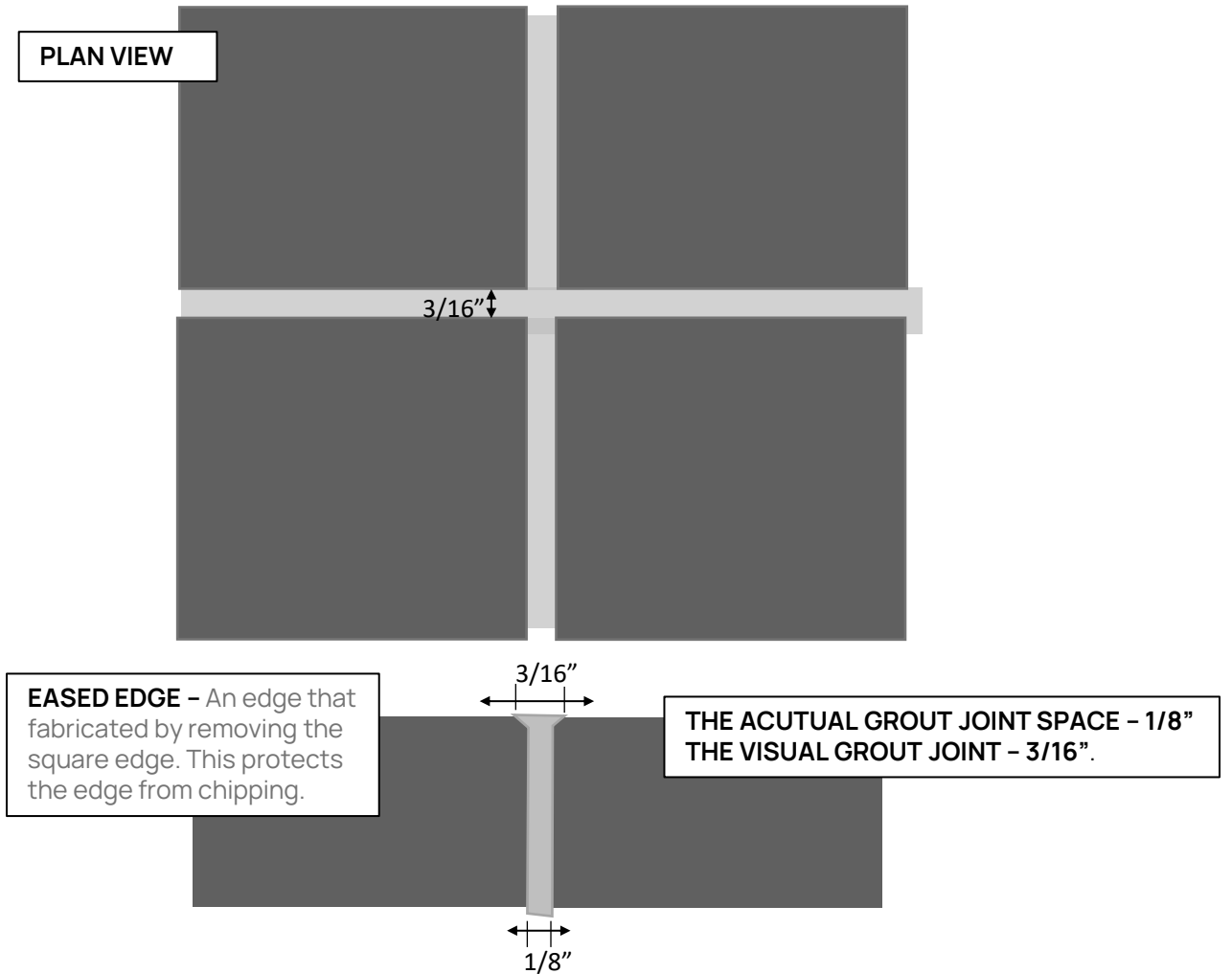
Cushioned: Difficulty Level Easiest

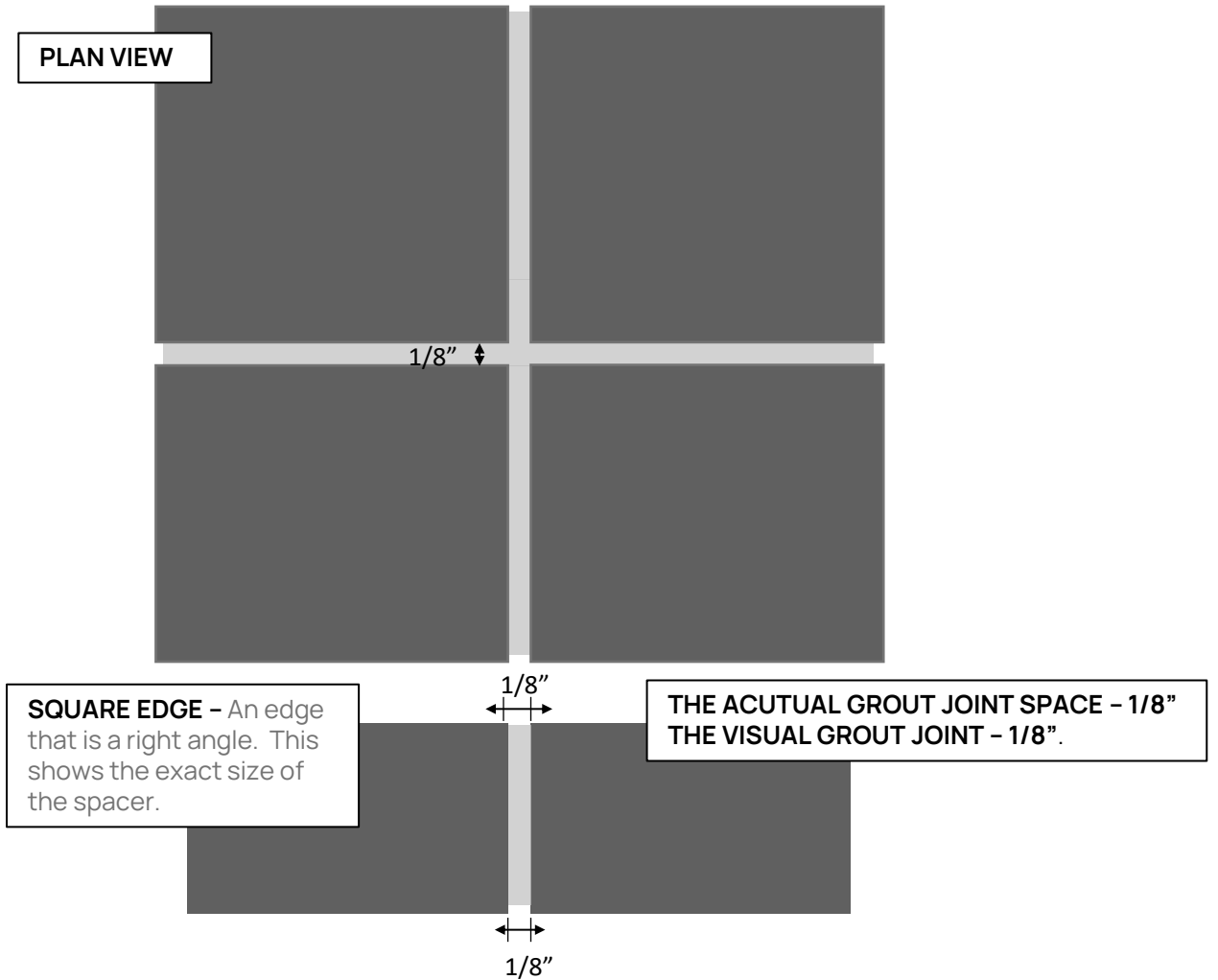
Eased Edge: Difficulty Level Moderate

Final Thoughts

Grout joints are a pivotal part of a successful tile installation. It is up to us to help the community understand the technical and aesthetic aspects of these joints. Choose the joint size carefully; think through it with each different tile. Just because the consumer wants a smaller joint doesn't mean they need a small joint.

1. All ceramic, glass and stone tile must have a joint, This is most commonly filled with grout.
2. The size of the grout joint depends on a few things:
 - The Installers skill level. The smaller the grout joint the more difficult the installation.
 - The squareness of the tile. All tiles vary in size and this difference directly affects the joint size.
 - The flatness of the substrate.
